TEXAS REVIVAL FIRE IGNITES IN ATLANTA



“I have not seen this tangible, pure, raw power of His fire—of His Spirit—in a long time.”

(Atlanta, GA) This gathering was different from the very beginning. As people filed into Breaking the Evil Mirror on June 13th, there was a palpable expectation in the air. Faith filled the room like an invisible weight. What some thought would be just another Christian event quickly proved to be an encounter that none involved will soon forget.

Before the first notes of music were played during worship, the altar was full and overflowing with people encountering the Lord. The service hadn't yet begun, but weeping and the muttering of prayer could be heard rising throughout the room. The people had come to the altar, and the Lord had met them there.

People had come for deliverance and had already gained something better—an encounter with the fire of the deliverer.

The crucial change in the order of service set the Atlanta meeting apart from the others that the ministry has hosted previously. Ed Citronnelli, founder and lead Apostle of World Healing Church in Arlington, Texas, explained, “In Atlanta, we patterned it with the altar [of prayer] first, so it was not a conference. It was not an event. Because prior to Atlanta, the Lord said to me, ‘What you have seen happening at the church, pattern Atlanta likewise.’ So before anything, we opened the altar.”

The Fire Came From Arlington

This re-prioritization of the altar of prayer is one of the fruits of what's happening in Apostle Ed's ministry in Texas, where his congregation at World Healing Church has been experiencing a prolonged corporate encounter with the Fire of the Holy Spirit.

On Sunday, May 17th, what was intended to be a sermon entitled "When Revival Fire Comes" became a lived experience for the congregation before the message could be preached. Worship began as usual, but dissolved into weeping both on the platform and off. The worship leader lay prostrate in reverence to the Spirit of the Lord, and the rest of the team fell silent. The music director visibly struggled to hold back tears as he tried to keep the music going.

An awareness of the Fear of the Lord hit the room and hung in the air like static before a lightning strike. Time was suspended. Suddenly, a voice cracked through the room as corporate prophecy began to ring out. An usher, and then a security guard, and then a deacon under the unction of the Holy Spirit. It was a service that made the Apostle Paul's instructions to the Corinthian Church from nearly two thousand years ago suddenly relevant today.

A New Way of Doing Things

The fire that broke out during that service has led to an overhaul of how the church and Apostle Ed facilitate ministry. The local assembly quickly adjusted its schedule to add extended times of prayer to the corporate rhythm, with a group meeting at least four times per week. In many of these meetings, you won't find the timelines, media, or the professional worship team that the church has become known for. Instead, ending only when the Holy Spirit says so, you will find people surrendered and postured under the corporate spirit of prayer. The prayer meetings have been marked by travail, deep repentance, holy silence, and laughter in the Holy Spirit.



This change in priorities impacted the local church, but also had a notable effect in Atlanta. "As the service progressed and we began to minister, I have not seen this tangible, pure, raw power of His fire—of His Spirit—in a long time," shared Apostle Citronnelli. This is significant, as Apostle Ed's gatherings have become known over the years to include miracles, healings, and mass deliverance.

What made Atlanta different was the intensity with which the power of God was present and manifested. Confusion was released into the camp of the enemy as people were set free from spiritual bondage and sickness. That which the enemy had stolen was restored to the people of God.

Breaking Evil Mirrors

The full depth of the fruit of this gathering is yet to be seen. But, from the initial reports, it is expected to be far-reaching. Apostle Ed has taught on deliverance and exposing the hidden works of darkness for the better part of two decades. In the months leading up to the event, he went beyond marketing to teach the foundational components of the spiritual reality of evil mirrors and monitoring spirits.



Put in simple terms, an evil mirror or a monitoring mirror is the term Apostle Ed uses to describe a particular set of documented occult practices that workers of darkness use to spy on and sabotage followers of Jesus Christ. These methodologies for partnering with evil spirits to accomplish these actions are well documented in historical and cultural texts. The Biblical reality of demonic monitoring can be observed in Job chapter one where, when questioned on his whereabouts, Satan tells the Lord he had been "going to and fro on the earth, and from walking back and forth on it."

(Job 1:6) This is the same Satan that 1 Peter 5:8 says, “*walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour.*” As the exchange between God and Satan continues, Satan demonstrates that he has clear knowledge of Job’s possessions, blessings, and wealth. The objectives and tactics of the kingdom of darkness have not changed. Satan monitored Job then and continues to monitor people today.

Many believers experience failure at the edge of breakthrough. They find themselves at the cusp of opportunities or change, only to have things go wrong at the last moment. Monitoring mirrors are often used to cause these delays. The Lord says that His people perish for lack of knowledge (Hosea 4:6). Believing this

means that acquiring and applying Biblical knowledge can save people from chaos and disaster. Driven by a desire to see people set free and walking in the fullness of what Christ died for them to receive, Apostle Ed hosts specialized services like Breaking the Evil Mirror, Breaking the Evil Altar, and School of Spiritual Warfare to equip the American church in the realities of spiritual warfare that many in places like South America, the Caribbean, and Africa already understand.

Perhaps more powerful, the Kingdom of God was expanded. Numerous salvations were recorded as the Gospel was presented. The altar that overflowed with weeping before the service officially began

became the source of rejoicing in heaven as people publicly made decisions to accept the finished work of Christ’s atoning blood.

As Apostle Ed and his team hurried back to Arlington to tend the corporate fire at World Healing Church, it was undeniable that it had traveled with them. Of course, this is not surprising, given the instructions of the Lord to Apostle Ed, “You have one mandate: Repair the altar. Bring my people back to the altar, and back to my fire—my Presence.”

The fire of revival is continuing to burn in Arlington, Texas.

MAN DOWN: WHEN GOD LAUGHS FIRST

LAUGHTER OVERTAKES ARLINGTON CONGREGATION

June 25, 2026

(Arlington, TX) When the Founder and Lead Apostle of World Healing Church walked in to preach the sermon on June 21st, he didn't know that this would be a Father's Day to remember. Wearing a navy-blue suit, Ed Citronnelli was carrying a burden that day that wouldn't be revealed to the congregation until nearly halfway through the service. He wasn't only a husband to his wife of over three decades. He wasn't only a father of three or a grandfather of four with more on the way. He was a man, carrying the sovereign weight of souls that God had entrusted him to steward. A heavy and holy responsibility that most spiritual leaders agree costs everything. As Dietrich Bonhoeffer penned in his book *The Cost of Discipleship*, "When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die."

When Apostle Ed walked in, he found a room that had been moving with the ebbs and flows of the river of the Spirit of the Lord, but something else was about to happen. Like the voice of the Father cracking through the atmosphere at Jesus' baptism (see Matthew 3:16-17) or speaking from the cloud on the Mount of Transfiguration (see Matthew 17:5), the affirming and comforting Word of the Lord was about to bellow forward toward the man of God.



One prophetic word, and then another, and another. The Good Shepherd had come to tend His undershepherd's heart.

The Spirit of the Lord had apprehended the order of service and left a stillness hanging in the air that mingled with the weight of the deep work that those words had been sent forth to accomplish. The room sat quiet. Commanded to attention and attuned to heaven. Waiting. Suddenly, a laugh began in the front of the sanctuary. Pronounced and steady, the media team would quickly locate the source—Apostle Ed.

He laughed deeply and to the point of breathlessness. The more he seemed to try to contain it, the heartier the laugh became. And, the more the laughter grew within him, the more it seemed to spread through the room. That is one of the

beautiful things about laughter. It is highly contagious, no matter if the laughter is birthed in the Spirit or in the natural.

Laughter begets laughter. This follows the Kingdom law of reproduction that fruit produces after its kind (Genesis 1:12). Joy is a fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22). If laughter is like a pressure valve that releases the overflow from within us, then Apostle Ed was at critical mass, and the congregation wasn't far behind. The room was in an uproar. The more he laughed, the more the room laughed, and vice versa. He rocked in his chair. He hammered his knee with his fist, and at times he gasped for air.

Throughout the congregation, the same scene seemed to play out.



Some chuckled quietly. Some rocked and reeled in their seats. Some yelled. Loud and long ‘ah ha ha’s’ and ‘bwah ha ha ha’s’ rose and fell with playful syncopation. Some appeared to become weak and slouched in their seats, shaking with the silence only laughter can evoke. A security team member walked through the room, microphone in hand, hoping to amplify the sound of those encountering the joy of the Lord. However, due to his own laughter, it was a bit like using a kerosene lamp to examine whether the barn was on fire.

When the laughter subsided, another wave of congregational prophecy swept across the room.

When the Spirit of the Lord released the service into transition, Apostle Ed took the platform, bringing corporate unity with a congregational hymn. There was now a lightness in the air as the man of God addressed the service. “I know this is Father’s Day, obviously, but I want you to understand one thing,” he explained. “And that is that the Word of the Lord through the Apostle Paul said that ‘with many trials and tribulations we shall enter the kingdom of heaven’ (Acts 14:22). But within the tribulation there’s always the hand of the Lord to bring us through. . . On Father’s Day, the Father of Fathers gave me the greatest visitation today that any human father can ever receive on the earth. I’ve been refreshed today, and this goes beyond any gift. . .”

A Welcomed Fruit of Renewal

Although the scene at World Healing Church on Father’s Day was certainly a sight to see, it wasn’t the first time this had happened. The small local congregation has been experiencing what some in the charismatic movement call a renewal. Often marked by deep repentance, reprioritization of key pillars of the Christian faith, and shifts in the hearts of both leaders and laity, the experience at WHC has been no different.

Following a dynamic and rich outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Sunday, May 17th, the congregation was thrust into the labor room of a full-scale revival. Service flows, meeting times, and ministry priorities were all adjusted to better align with what the Lord had suddenly poured out of His Spirit. One immediate change was a return to the altar of prayer. The local church body began coming together frequently for times of corporate intercession. In the week immediately following the outpouring, they were gathered together daily.



On the fifth consecutive day of prayer following the initial visitation, something peculiar happened. Deep into the meeting, a prophetic word came forward. “I laugh at your enemies,” the Lord began to speak through a member of the security team. “Laugh with me,” said the Lord towards the end of the utterance, and the prophetic voice the Lord had been using began to laugh. It was not a giggle. This vessel of God was cracking up, and soon, pockets of laughter were popping up around the sanctuary. Quiet snickers gave way to deep guffaws. Some, by their own admission, began to laugh in the flesh, only to quickly be taken over by the Spirit of the Lord.

At the altar that evening, Apostle Ed, dressed in all white, struggled to contain himself. He later acknowledged, “I was trying to be strong, and I was fighting against the laughter that was happening inside of me. And in my head, I’m saying ‘no, you’re not.’ Obviously, I lost that fight.”

The following evening, the same manifestation of the Presence of the Lord gripped the room. Those in attendance spent their Saturday meeting laughing and rejoicing in the Lord's refreshing joy.

The Science Agrees with God

Both Scripture and modern science agree that laughter is a blessing.

On the benefits of laughter, [Psychology Today](#) reports that the physical effects of laughter include a boosted immune system, muscle relaxation, and improved circulation. The publication also asserts that "laughter can lower anxiety, release tension, improve mood, and foster resilience." When people laugh, endorphins (feel-good brain chemicals) are released, and cortisol (stress hormone) levels are decreased. The Bible frames it this way in Proverbs 17:22: *"A merry heart does good, like medicine."*

When addressing the congregation following the initial manifestation of holy laughter, Apostle Ed said this: "I'll say what the Lord said to me. He said, 'They have pleased My heart, and they have touched My heart. And whoever touches My heart,' he said, 'finds what's in My heart. And one of the things that is in My heart is joy. So, they touched joy that was in My heart.' What you just witnessed is one of the fruit of the renewal of the Spirit."

THE PROMISED HOLY SPIRIT

YEARS-LONG PRAYER ANSWERED SUDDENLY IN PRAYER MEETING

"I've been praying for this for years!"

For one sister, an ordinary prayer meeting turned into a 'suddenly' from God, after years of prayer. She had been saved for quite some time and had seen person after person receive a gift from the Lord that she desperately wanted. She prayed and believed, but the promise she was waiting for had yet to manifest. Her longing was one that many in the Body of Christ take for granted: to be filled with the Holy Spirit with the evidence of speaking in tongues.

On Thursday, June 18th, the room was unhurried. World Healing Church had gathered to pray, a frequent occurrence since the congregation began experiencing a charismatic renewal one month prior. Following a corporate visitation on the Sunday before Pentecost, the local church was left with a renewed commitment to rebuilding the altar of prayer and immediately adjusted its service schedule to make space for regular extended times of corporate intercession and encounters in the Presence of the Lord.

This particular Thursday, as the pray-ers positioned themselves throughout the dimly lit sanctuary, the corporate word of the Lord cracked a pregnant silence that had settled in the room. "The harvest is coming. The drought is ending," Apostle Ed Citronnelli, the church's Founder and Senior Pastor, declared as he walked around the room. "Yes, the harvest is coming, and your drought is ending."

It was a powerful prophetic utterance, directly from the heart of the Father, that lasted over six minutes. Unbeknownst to those in the room, the drought for one among them would be over before the meeting dismissed.

When the group came together, Apostle Ed anchored the prophetic word that had just been released in scripture. He gave biblical context and historical understanding of the terms 'former' and 'latter rain,' strengthening the faith of those who listened. He also spoke on the interpretation of tongues. It was here that the testimony began.

After asking whether anyone there didn't speak in tongues, one sister, who was sitting attentively at the front, identified herself. Apostle Ed reassured her and asserted that he and the group would pray for her. At the end of the teaching, as he activated the group in the interpretation of tongues by having them pray and listen to the Holy Spirit for revelation of their individual prayers, he laid hands on the sister.

After some time, he asked her about her experience, explaining that many Christians, when they are first filled with the Holy Spirit, perceive the sound of tongues bubbling up within them, but don't release them because they think it is just their mind. Then, calling the room to surround the sister, he laid hands on her again. In the next moments, the Holy Spirit swept through the room. When the woman fell to the floor under the power of the Spirit, several of the women present got on the ground and continued to pray with her. It was a powerful time of ministry. Not only was the sister filled with the evidence of speaking in tongues, but many around the circle were refilled!

When the moment of prayer ended, an audible celebration arose. The woman's joy was contagious, with cheering and clapping erupting around the prayer circle

"I've been praying for this for years!" the sister exclaimed, even noting that she had mentioned it to Pastor David Ahart, Associate Pastor of World Healing Church, when she first came to the Freedom Arena. It was a convicting reminder to cherish the gift that the Lord has given us.

The Promised Holy Spirit

After the Resurrection, Jesus told his disciples not to leave Jerusalem until they received the promise of the Father, "*which, He said, 'you have heard from Me; for John truly baptized with water; but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.'*" (Acts 1:4-5). He had spoken of this promise during the Last Supper, saying:

- *"And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever—the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you."* (John 14:16-17)
- *"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you."* (John 14:26)
- *However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth; for He will not speak on His own authority, but whatever He hears He will speak; and He will tell you things to come. He will glorify Me, for He will take of what is Mine and declare it to you.* (John 16:13-14)

The Father kept this promise. In Acts chapter two, we read the thrilling account of the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the believers who were gathered in the upper room. Tongues of fire fell and landed on all who were present. *"And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance."* (Acts 2:4) In the moments to follow, the Church was catalyzed. When all was said and done, 3000 people came to faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Every church in existence today can be traced back to the upper room.

It is the infilling of the Holy Spirit that empowers the believer to obey the commandments of God, to fulfill the great commission, and to walk boldly in their calling. *"Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered."* (Romans 8:26)

"A church without the Holy Spirit is a country club," Apostle Ed declared in a recent message. When the Holy Spirit baptized that sister a few Thursdays ago, a long-awaited promise was being fulfilled in her life. This is significant. Thursday night prayer isn't a crusade, a full service, or a special event. It is, however, the Lord being in the midst of those who gather in His Name (Matthew 18:20). "That's why you

can't miss," said Apostle Ed as the testimony was recounted during the next Revival Encounter Service, "Because you don't know when God is gonna do something."
